

We invite you and/or your group to visit and see first-hand the ministry provided every day on our campus. Thank you so much for your prayers, your financial support, and all the many ways you make a difference at PCHH.

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FUN IN MOTION...



Recreation... Our Recreational Director helps keep our children active with many activities on campus. We also provide activities not available on campus such as bowling, skating, movies, and others designed to provide recreation and socialization opportunities. Sponsorships for an outing for the children are greatly appreciated. We average spending about \$100 per cottage, per week for outside recreational activities.



Nutrition Sponsor... As the cost of food rises, we can always use more monetary donations to help offset the cost of feeding our children. Our food budget is designed to provide three meals each day for each child plus an afternoon and evening snack. Growing young people need good, nutritious food and food accounts for over 10% of our annual budget of \$1.9M. Your sponsorship will make a difference in the life of this ministry.



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Part-Time Jobs... Residents are encouraged to pursue part-time jobs as their skills increase. Life skills classes open windows of possibilities for jobs associated with different levels of preparation. Education is strongly highlighted. Many residents begin their work experience with work opportunities on our campus before they venture out in the local community for part-time jobs.

Back-To-School... When it's back-to-school time, thoughts change from care-free casual dress of summer to pants and shirts more suitable for the classroom. As we all know, success in school requires a lot of supplies as well as clothes. The need for both does not stop with the first day of school. It's a year-round need for each student in any grade.



Gasoline Sponsor... Wow!
What can we say... an average of \$2,000 per month for gas. Help!



Weekly Allowances... Our children earn a weekly allowance based on our "level system" which quantifies behavior, school activities, recreational participation, etc. on a daily basis and calculated each week. The allowance amount ranges from \$3.00 to \$10.00 per week for Levels I-V. You may sponsor a cottage, individual child, or all three cottages for a week, month, or year. Houseparents provide guidance and living skill classes provide information on how to get the most from each consumer dollar. Soft drinks, candy, and presents for girl/boy friends still rank pretty high on their list of priorities.
